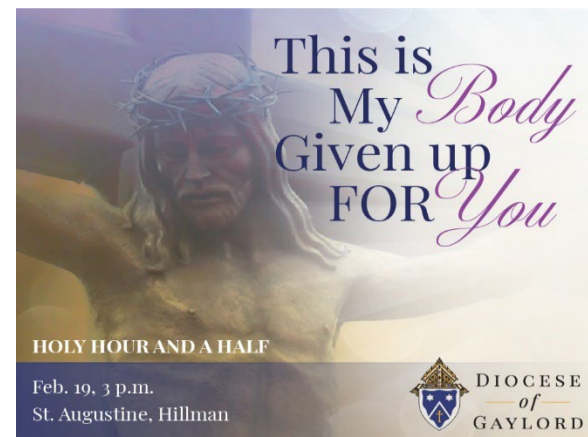

Our Lady of Guadalupe

As Juan Diego makes his way to Mass in the early morning of December 9, 1531, the quiet is broken by the beautiful sound of birds. Investigating the sound, Juan Diego comes face to face with a radiant apparition of the Virgin Mary on Tepeyac Hill, the site of a former Aztec Temple.

Juan Diego is dazzled by the incredible beauty and miraculous nature of Our Lady's appearance. She appears as a native princess to him, and her words sound more beautiful than the sweetest music ever made.

Our Lady calms the startled traveler, and assures him of who she is. She instructs Juan Diego to visit his bishop and ask that a temple be built on the site of her appearance, so that she will have a place to hear petitions and to heal the suffering of the Mexican people.

Juan Diego approaches the Bishop with her request. The Bishop patiently listens to Juan Diego's accounts and dismisses him. The humble farmer has failed.

Juan Diego returns to Tepeyac Hill. Our Lady appears again, as radiant as before. Juan Diego tells Our Lady that the Bishop did not believe him. She instructs him to return the next morning and ask again.

The Bishop is beside himself. Why did this peasant insist on telling this story? At their second meeting, the Bishop asks for a sign. Juan Diego promises he will return with a sign from Our Lady.

But that evening, Juan Diego returns home to find his uncle, Juan Bernadino, suddenly, terribly ill. The illness, known to the people, brings a burning fever almost always fatal. Juan Diego cannot leave his uncle's bedside to keep his pledge to the Bishop. When it becomes apparent his uncle is about to die, he leaves to find a priest who can prepare him for death. On the road Our Lady appears for a third time.

Upset and afraid, Juan explains himself. Our Lady replies, "Am I not your mother?" she asks. Shamed by the admonishment, but emboldened by Our Lady's presence, Juan Diego asks for the sign he promised to the Bishop. Juan Diego is instructed to climb to the top of Tepeyac Hill where he will find flowers. He is to pick the flowers there, and keep them hidden in his tilma until he reaches the Bishop.

For the third time, Juan Diego is ushered in to see the Bishop. Juan opens his tilma letting the roses cascade to the floor. But more than the roses, both men are astonished to see what is painted on his humble tilma - an exquisite image of Our Lady.

In the image we see a native princess with high cheekbones. Her head is bowed and her hands are folded in prayer to God. On her blue cloak, the stars are arranged as they appeared in the morning darkness at the hour of her first apparition. Under her feet is a great crescent moon, a symbol of the old Aztec religion. The message is clear, she is more powerful than the Aztec gods, yet she herself is not God.

At the same time Our appeared to Juan Diego she also appeared to his uncle, Juan Bernadino, the fever stops. She tells Juan Bernadino, she wants to be known as "Santa Maria, de Guadalupe."

Our Lady of Guadalupe did not appear again, for her mission was complete. The temple was built and remains there today, in what is now a suburb of Mexico City. Juan Diego's tilma, woven from cactus fibers, with a shelf-life of just 30 years at best, remains miraculously preserved.

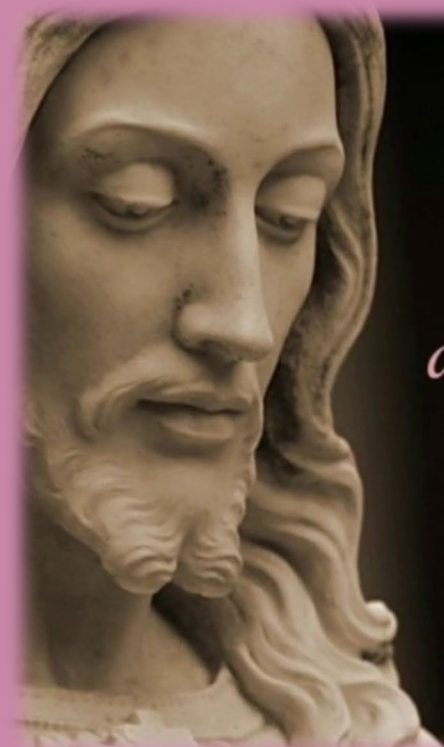
