Why do we have penitential seasons?

Jesus gave the example of a penitential retreat, spending prayerful time in the desert preparing for his ministry, reflecting on God's will, and determining how he'd freely make that happen.

Penitential seasons offer us this same opportunity: to withdraw from our resources and evaluate our spiritual progress or regression. We do this through reflection and repentance, which enables us to identify our weaknesses and make reparation to amend our sinful ways. Penitential seasons create time to reflect on our need to make God the focal point of our lives. The result can be spiritually rewarding.

Am I Not Your Mother?

It is true that conversion cannot be forced, so how do we reach those who have left us? With

love and compassion, acknowledging their pain for a start, as Our Lady of Guadalupe did for Juan Diego. I am your merciful Mother, the merciful Mother of all who live united in this land, and of all

mankind, of all those who love me, of those who cry to me, of those who have confidence in me. Here I will hear their weeping and their sorrows, and I will remedy and alleviate their sufferings, necessities and misfortunes.

Listen and let it penetrate your heart, my dear little son, let nothing discourage you, nothing depress you. Am I not here who am your Mother? Are you not under my shadow and protection? What

else do you need? Yes, what else do we need? We who understand say, "Nothing Mother. Thank you, Mother."

But those who are outside, those who don't understand, how can we reach them?

Some of those who

have left feel betrayed by God through the suffering they have endured or are enduring. They feel He had no compassion for them because He allowed the suffering, or is allowing the suffering.

We know that Jesus Christ was fully man and fully God. Jesus while on earth told us if we can see Him we are seeing the Father. We know that Jesus

showed compassion by healing and forgiving sin.
He wept over the death of his friend. And so, our Father in heaven must also feel compassion, and must weep. We must also remember that He knows what it means to have a Son suffer and die an embarrassing death on a cross though innocent of any crime. If His Son could suffer, why should we complain about our suffering? Are we somehow better

crime. If His Son could suffer, why should we complain about our suffering? Are we somehow better than the Son of God? What right do we have to question God in the first place? Were we there when He created the heavens and the earth from the void?

Look to Mary. She is fully human. Her life was one of

sorrow and suffering and yet she comes to comfort us. She bore the suspicion of family and friends for her pregnancy, she rode a donkey to Bethlehem while nine months pregnant, she had to flee her homeland to protect her child, she became a widow, and watched her son be captured by the leaders of her Church, taken to the occupying army to be tortured and crucified and die on a cross by enemy hands. Yet she has come to several generations as she came to Juan Diego, saying "I am your mother." Share with those who are suffering, and with those who blame God for their suffering, that God understands. His Blessed Mother understands. They did not bring evil into the world; it came with sin. But if the human heart reaches out, their heavenly hearts will respond and Love and Peace will come.
