Revelation
The Bible is God's way of speaking to us. He gives us history, poetry, philosophy. He tells stories, gives examples, choices and consequences. In all, He reveals to us who He is and what He is about. He uses all these methods to reach each part of our mind, both right brain and left brain. And yet, we still claim not to know Him. The final blow came when he sent His Son to die for us, and still we refuse to know...for if we knew we would change, and change is frightening. God reveals Himself to us so we can form an intimate relationship with Him, but He does not force us, we have the right to choose.

When we read the stories in the Old Testament we say, we would never do that. How could the Israelites be led through the Red Sea, be fed by Manna in the desert, and yet turn their backs on Him? How could they have the Ten Commandments and still do wrong? The answer is legalism. We took the words and made them laws to obey, down to the smallest detail, but they did not enter our hearts. Even when we were told God does not want more bullocks from our herds but a changed heart, we refused to understand.

When God sent His Son, he tried a different tack. Jesus preached love and mercy. In story after story, he demonstrated His Father's life and thought. In the Prodigal Son, even the one who wasted his inheritance was forgiven. In the Workers in the Vineyard, even the one who came at the last hour received full wages. In each story we are the younger brother, or the worker who began at the first hour, we want Justice for ourselves. We deserve more. But God is not like us, if He were, we could not bear the justice we deserve. He is telling us He loves us, not as self-serving man loves us, but with the Holy Love that forgives and wants only for us to return to Him and love Him in return.

He came to us as a baby, the most helpless age and yet the most loved, for who does not love a baby? Herod did not, he knew the baby represented change to the world, at least change to his world. We too avoid accepting this baby for what he represents and so fill His season with hurried madness when Advent is all about the contemplation of the majesty of God coming to Earth to become one with humanity. We should be grateful to have this Covid time to reflect on family and the Love of God. All he asks of us is to join Him and become one with God. Imagine, God and Man becoming one in Love.
