Give Your "Self" Away

Whoever seeks to gain his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life will preserve it.

Charity inspires a life of self-giving. If we give totally of ourselves to God and to our fellow man, we will gain, if not we will lose. It may seem like a scary thing to give ourselves away, but it is the only way to save ourselves. So, where do we begin our life of service, our giving away

The order of *things* must be subordinate to the order of *persons* and not the other way around. This order is founded on truth, built up in justice, and animated by love. It requires the full participation of each person to promote institutions that improve the conditions of human life, and that provide generations to come with reason for life and optimism. It calls for an organization of the community of nations able to "provide for the different needs of men: food, hygiene, education, and current problems such as alleviating the miseries of refugees, and assisting migrants and their families." Instead of feeling helpless in light of these problems, we can support financially and with prayer the organizations which provide help for the needs of mankind.

We can serve our fellow man locally when we see our neighbor as "another self." Without exception! As you did to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me. No legislation can do away with the fears, prejudices and attitudes of pride and selfishness which obstructs Charity and Love in a society; only Charity and Love themselves can do so when we find in every man a brother. The same thing with those who think or act differently from ourselves. The Lord requires forgiveness of offenses; He requires Love of our enemies. This Love is incompatible with hatred of one's enemy as a person, but not with hatred of the evil that he does as an enemy.

It might help us to better serve our fellow humans if we remember that each of us is created in the image of the one God and equally endowed with rational souls, all men have the same nature and the same origin. Redeemed by the sacrifice of Christ, all are called to participate in the same divine Love, and all therefore enjoy an equal dignity, whether this is recognized by the rest of society or not. It is not our place to judge, but it is our responsibility to share our talents with those who need them. kvs


