Fasting

Prayer, fasting and almsgiving, the trinity of Lent. This week let us focus on fasting. There isn't much required of us, no meat on Fridays during Lent and only two days of fasting - Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The requirement to refrain from meat on Friday is in place throughout the entire year, though outside of Lent one may replace another sacrifice for the meatless day. The days of fasting are regulated only for those age 17 through 59, and not for those whose physical states would be negatively affective by the fast. The actual fast is not severe; we are asked to have only one full meal on the fast day, but are allowed two additional smaller meals.

As with any choices we may make, if they are not done with a joyful heart, they have little value. God love us, and His only desire is that we love Him in return. Because of Love, He has given us free will, and grace abounding. But there is no grace if love is forced, or fasting, or prayer, or almsgiving is forced. Freely He love us, and freely He wishes to be loved in return.

Speaking of prayer, how is your prayer life going? We discovered this week that, depending on traffic and where one lives, one can recite ten to fifteen decades of the rosary on the way to Alpena. Once there, between the waiting room and the exam room, one can complete a Divine Mercy Chaplet. From the house to the car, one can ask our Guardian Angel to be with us on our journey, and during a commercial one can speak to God asking for his mercy on our government, on the shooters in Minnesota, and on those running for office. When our focus is on God in the moments of our lives, it becomes ever easier to talk to Him, to share our lives, our dreams, our wishes for our country, our world, our families. He never leaves us; we only ignore Him.

The prophet Joel tells us: *Even now, says* the Lord, return to me with your whole heart, with fasting, and weeping, and mourning. Rend your hearts, not your garments, and return to the Lord, your God...Blow the trumpet in Zion! Proclaim a fast, call an assembly; gather the people, notify the congregation; assemble the elders, gather the children and the infants at the breast...And say, "Spare, O Lord, your people..."

What will you fast from? What needs to be *less* in your life?

Grant, O Lord, that we may begin with holy fasting this campaign of Christian service, so that, as we take up battle against spiritual evils, we may be armed with weapons of self-restraint. kvs
