From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity draws our attention to the central mystery of the Christian faith: there is one God in three divine Persons; the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Every prayer of the Church, every sacrament, and every work of salvation flows from and returns to this mystery of divine life and love.

In the Gospel, Our Lord commands His apostles: "Go therefore and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." These words remind us that the mystery of the Trinity is not merely an abstract doctrine to be studied. It is the very life into which Christians are baptized.

The Catechism teaches that through Baptism the soul is cleansed from sin, reborn in grace, and marked forever as belonging to God. Baptism is therefore not simply a family custom or symbolic ceremony. It is a true supernatural rebirth. Through the pouring of water and the invocation of the Most Holy Trinity, a person becomes a child of God, a member of Christ's Church, and a temple of the Holy Spirit.

For this reason, the Church has always treated Baptism with great reverence and seriousness. Catholic parents have the sacred duty to bring their children promptly to the sacrament and then faithfully raise them in the practice of the faith. Likewise, godparents are entrusted with a genuine spiritual responsibility. Their role is not merely honorary or social, but one of prayer, example, and support in helping the baptized persevere in Christian life.

Trinity Sunday also reminds us of the immense dignity of every baptized Christian. Every time we make the Sign of the Cross, we recall both the Trinity and our Baptism. We remember that we have been marked with the divine Name and called to live as sons and daughters of God.

In a world often marked by confusion and forgetfulness of God, Christians are called to live in a way that reflects the life of the Trinity itself, through charity, truth, holiness, and fidelity. The grace given in Baptism is not meant to remain dormant. It is meant to grow through prayer, worship, repentance, and the sacraments until one day, by God's mercy, we are brought into the eternal joy of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

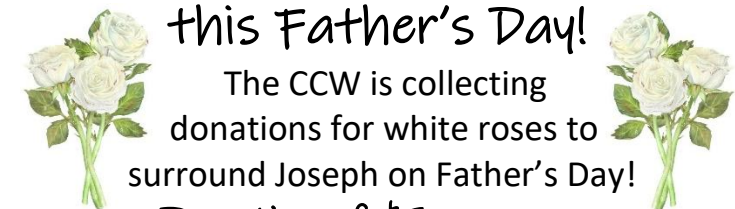

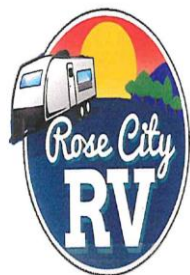


